








Terms Used to Describe the Land Plants Grow On

area

(ar·ea)

An area is a piece of ground or space set aside for special use.



wild (wild)




In the wild things grow or are produced without human aid and care.

region


(re·gion)

A region is a part, portion, or area having no fixed boundaries.



landscape

(land·scape)



A landscape is the land that can be seen in one glance.

frontier

(fron·tier)



A frontier is a region that forms the edge of the settled part of a country.

(ter·ri·to·ry)



A territory is a geographic area belonging to or under the control of a government.

It is also an area that is occupied and defended by an animal or group of animals

A zone is any of five great divisions of the earth's surface with respect to latitude and temperature.
