



Othello

Othello is a play by Shakespeare about a Black general who leads the army of Venice. Even though some people are racist toward him, Othello is respected because he's a good fighter.

The story begins when Othello secretly marries Desdemona, a white woman from a rich family. This makes some people mad, especially a man named lago who acts like Othello's friend but really hates him.

The play shows how racism and jealousy can ruin a person's life, even someone as strong and successful as Othello.
