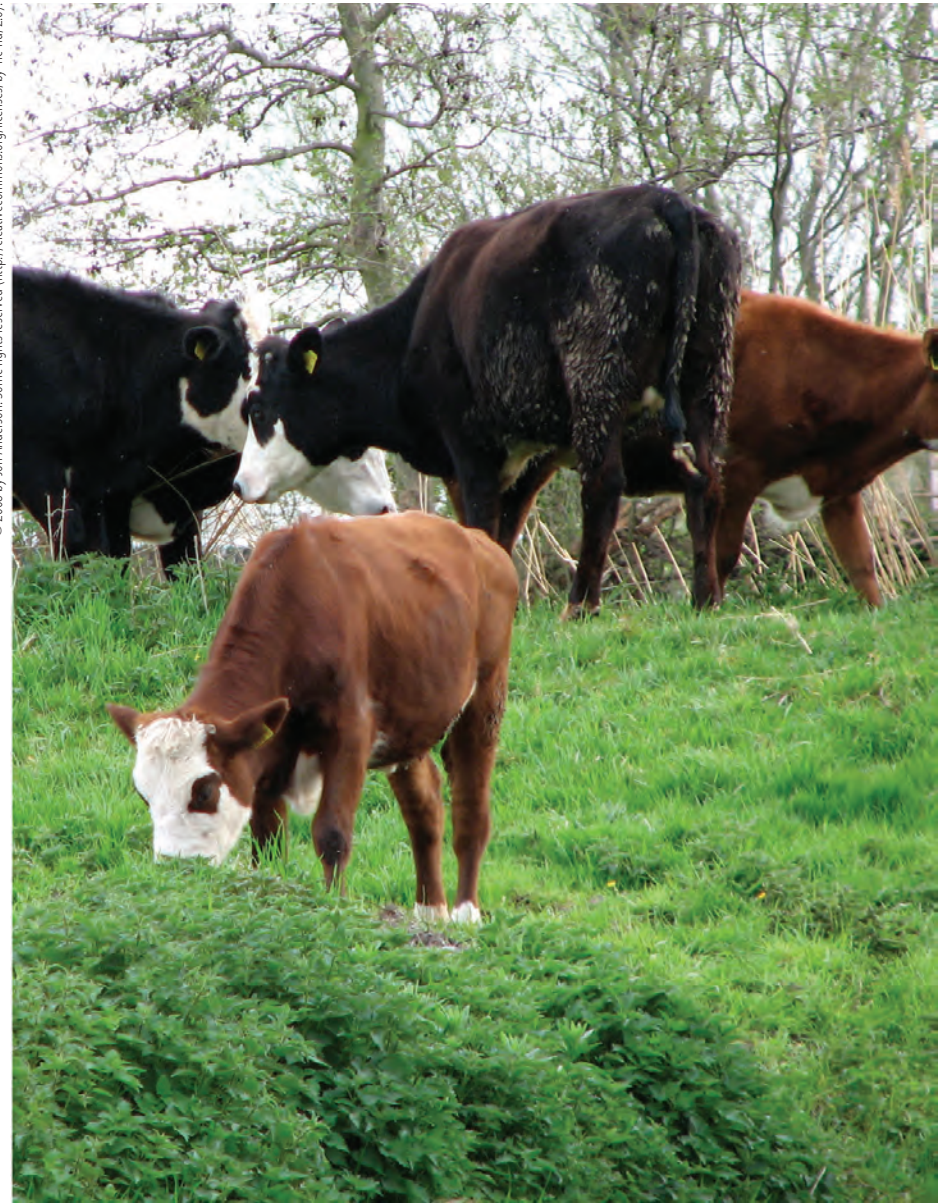

During the day, the cows are in the field where they eat a lot of grass. They swallow the grass but do not chew it.

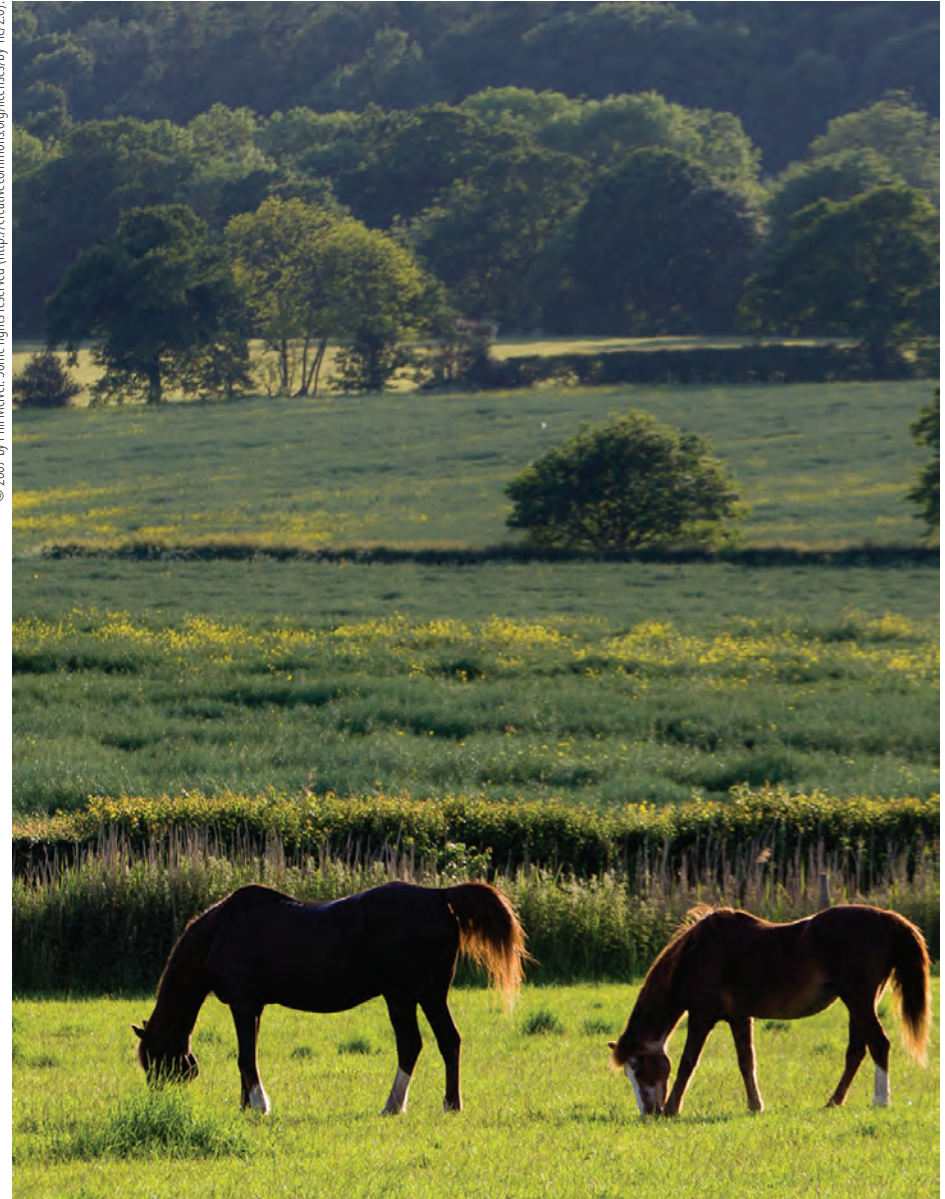

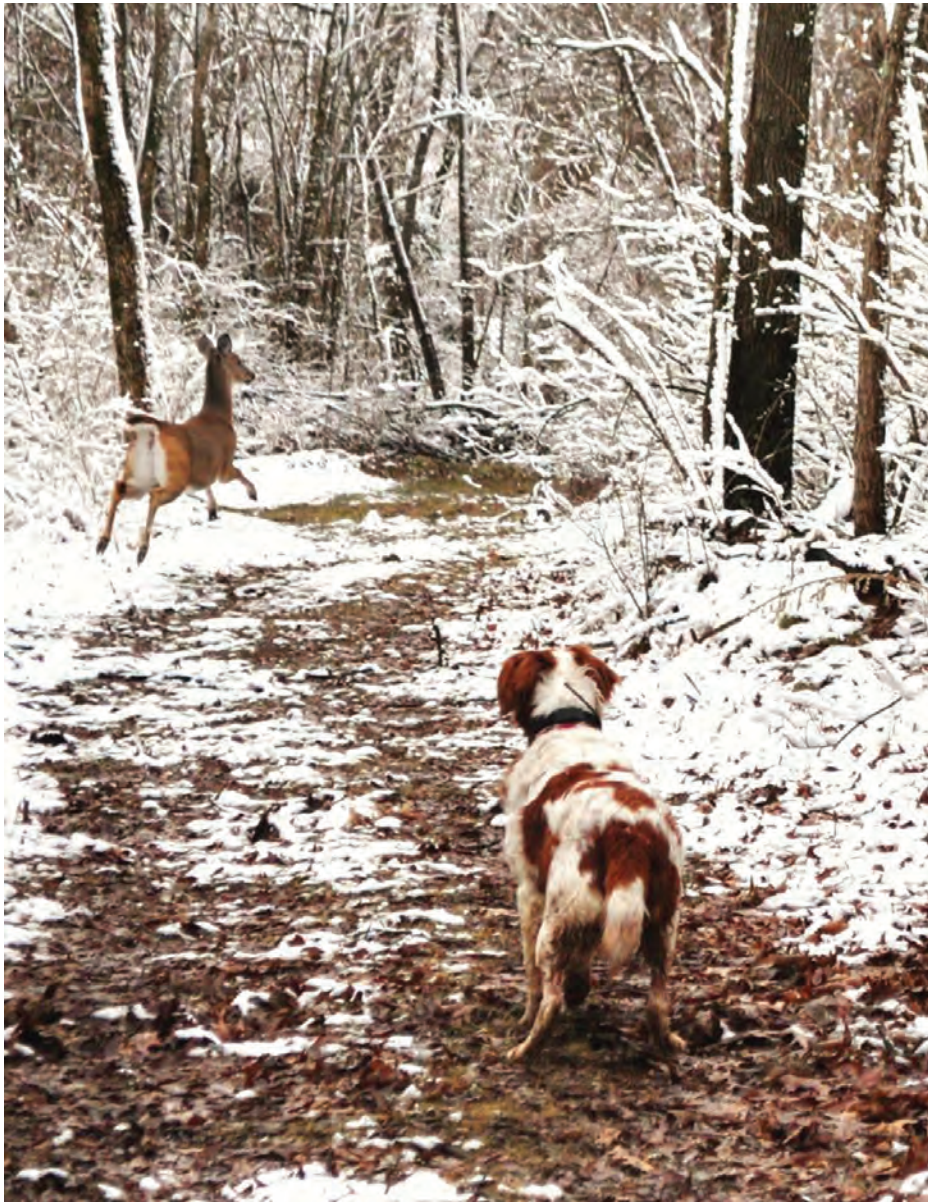

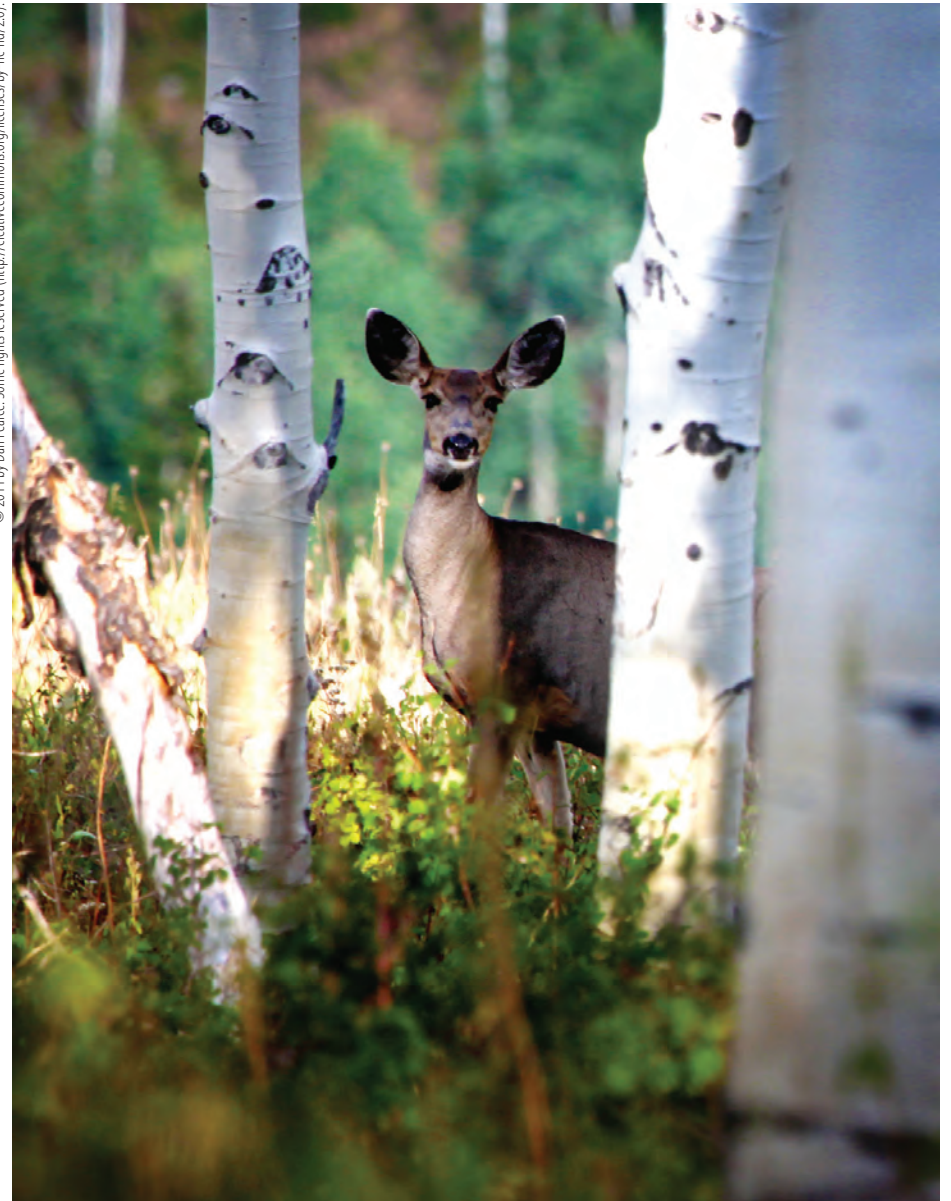
Among the Trees

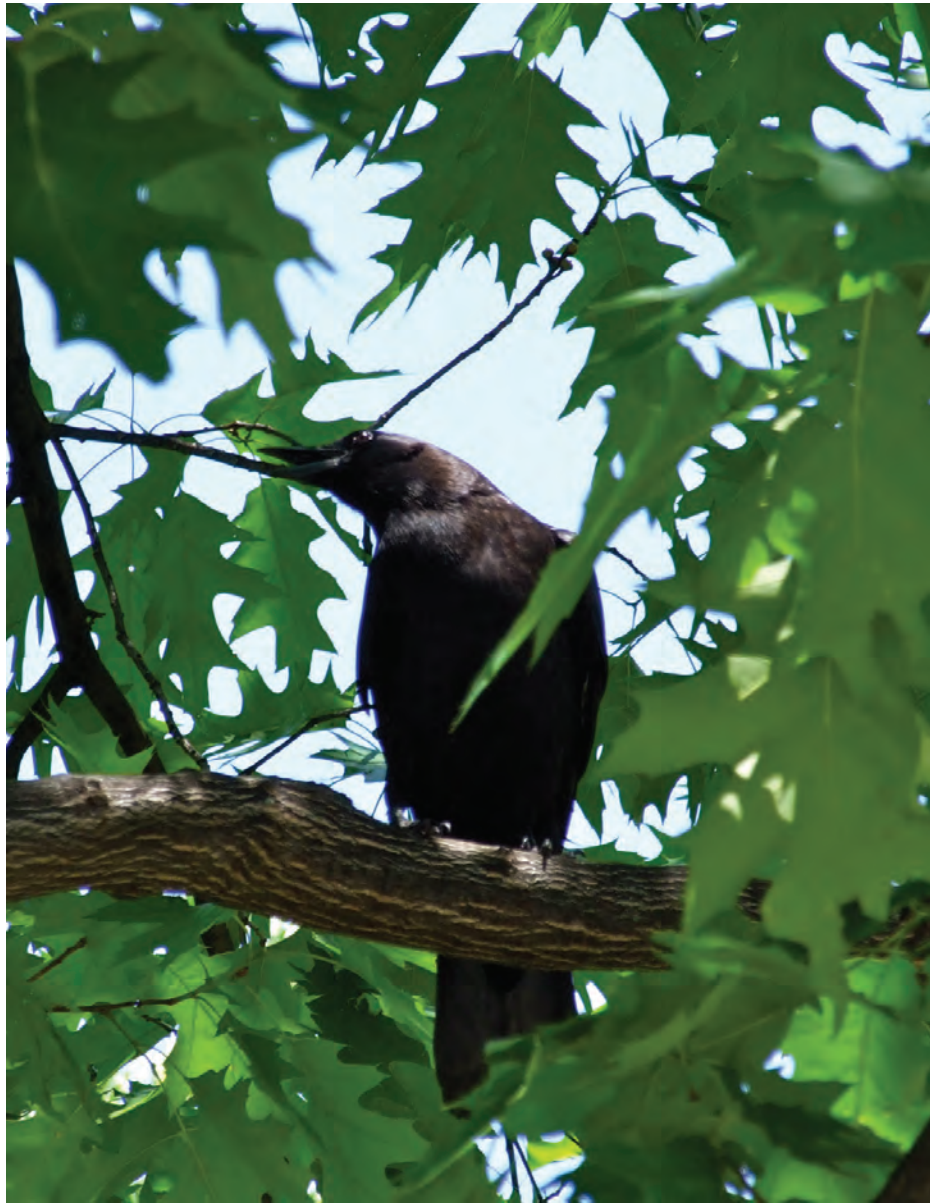

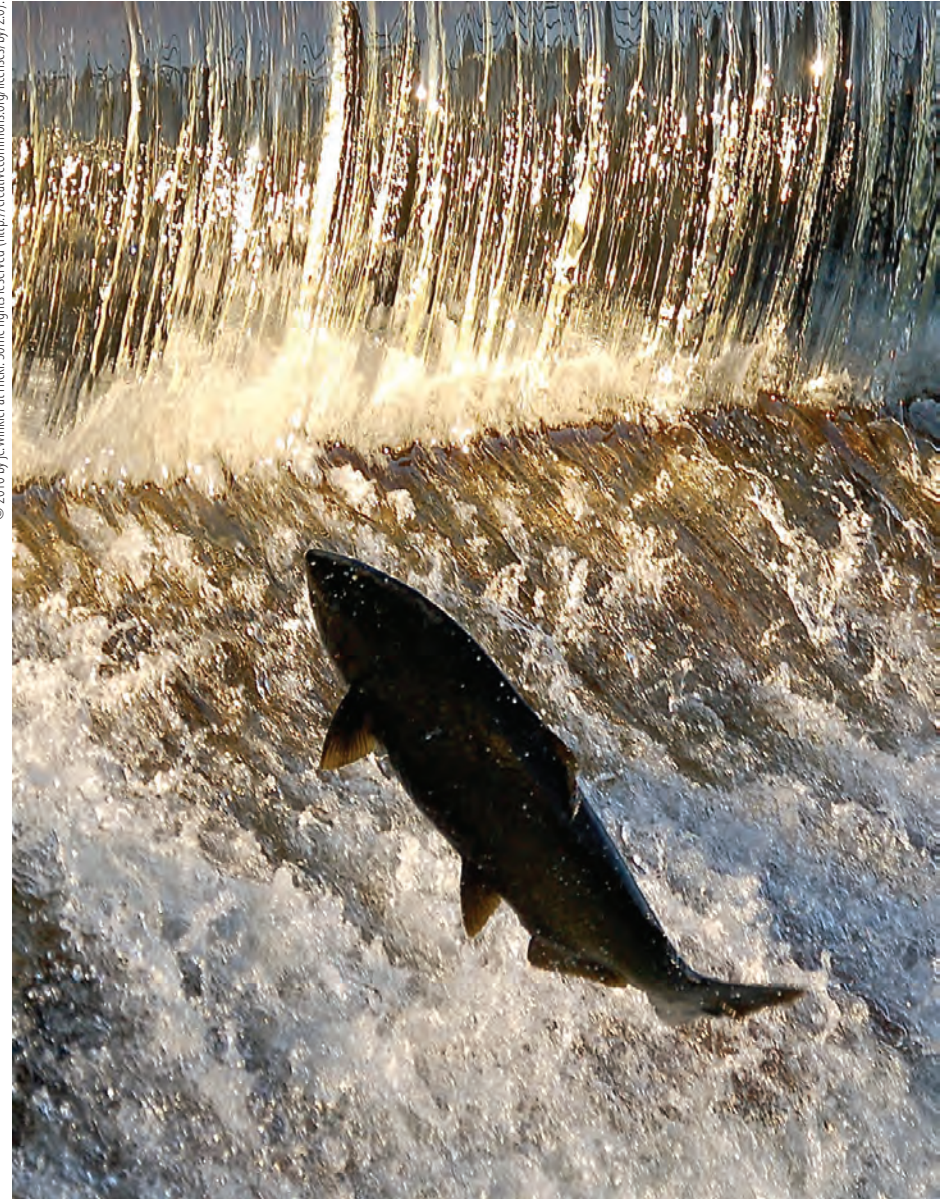
