



Almanac

(al·ma·nac)

Definition: A book giving a list of the days of a year, times the sun rises and sets, changes in the moon, etc.

Example: Ben Franklin gathered data about when the sun rises and sets to create an almanac.

(as·tro·naut)



(ed·u·ca·tion)






Inventor

(in·ven·tor)

Definition: someone who creates new things or new ways of doing something

Example: As an *inventor,* Thomas Edison created a new kind of light bulb that was more efficient and cheaper to make.

Definition: made or done in order to remind people of someone who has died.

Example: Many people visit the Vietnam War *Memorial* to honor the fallen soldiers.
