# Aqueduct (aq·ue·duct)

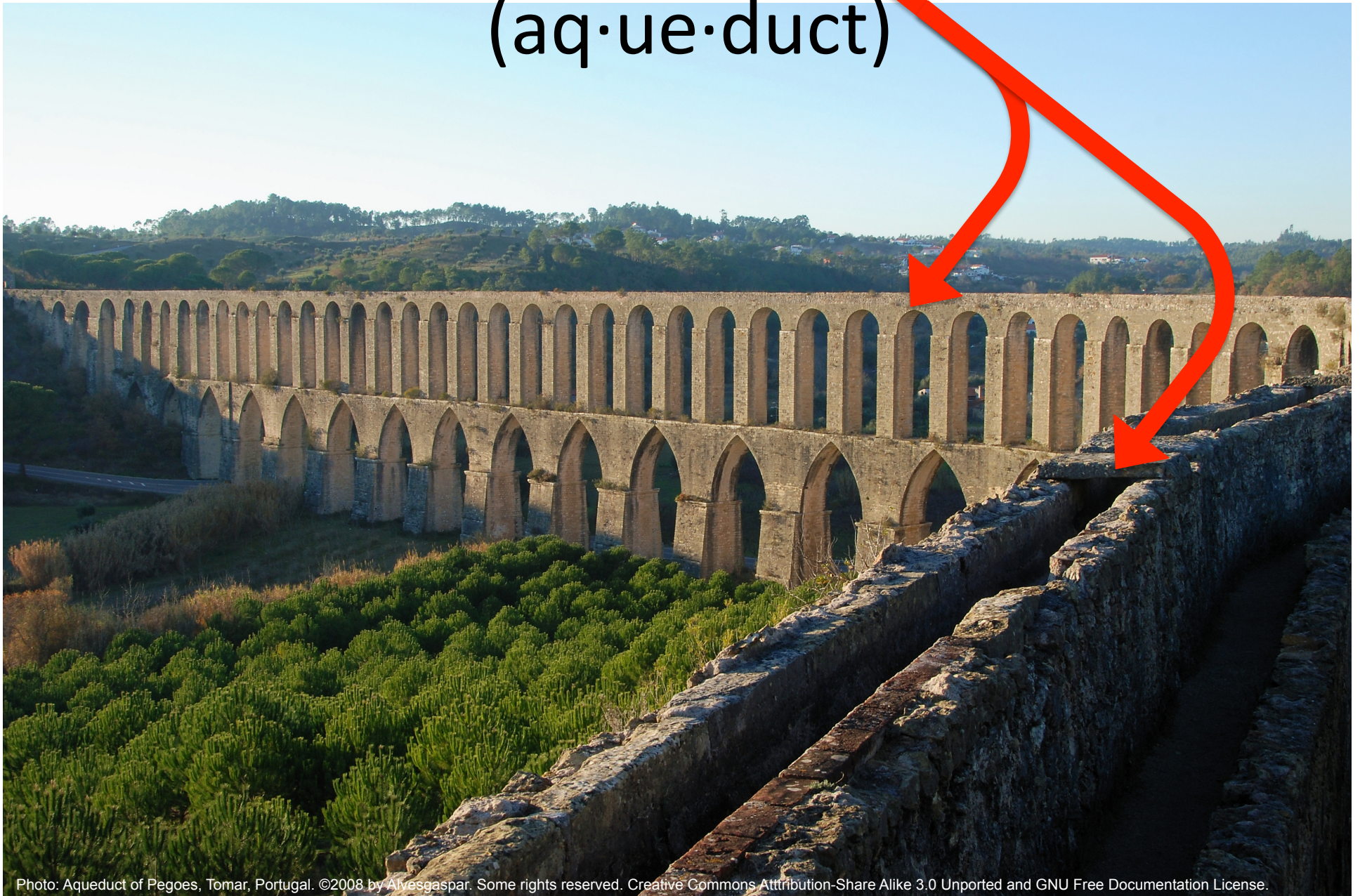

# Conquest (con·quest)

Definition:

the act of setting control of land or people by force

Example:

The Roman *Conquest* can be described as the Roman Empire's constant need to become more powerful.





# Constructed

(con·structed)

Definition:

To build something large such as a building or a bridge

Example:

The Romans *constructed* the Colosseum, so that they could have a place for people to watch Roman sports.

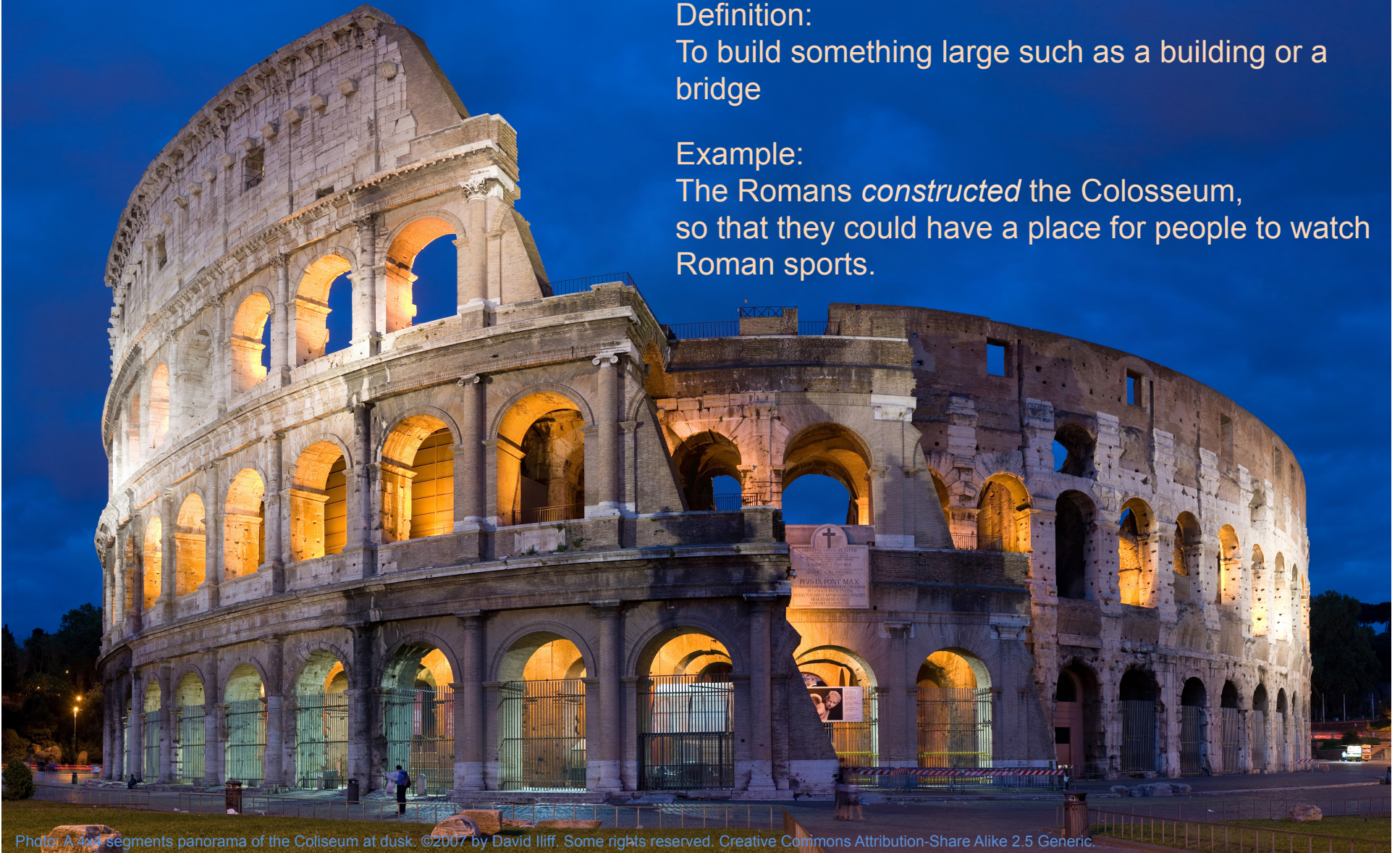


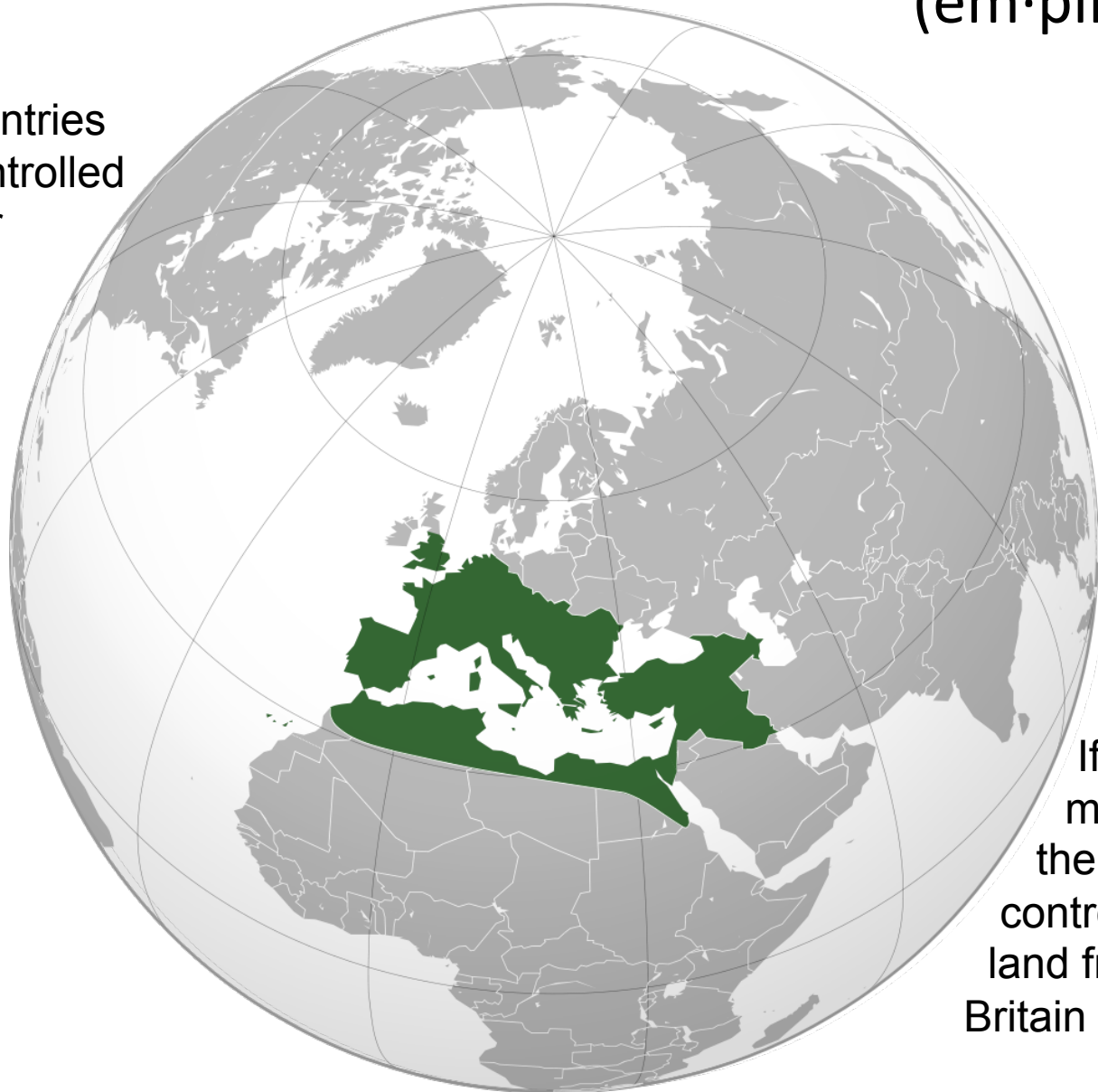

# Empire

(em·pire)

Definition:  
a group of countries  
that are all controlled  
by one ruler or  
government



Example:  
If we look at a  
modern map,  
the Roman *Empire*  
controlled all the  
land from Great  
Britain to Iraq.



# Enemies

(en·e·mies)

**Definition:**

Someone who hates you and wants to harm you or prevent you from being successful. The person or group of people that you are fighting in a war.

**Example:**

The Roman Empire fought many wars and therefore had many *enemies*.

# Engineer

(en·gi·neer)



## Definition:

Someone whose job is to design build and repair object such as roads, bridges, machines; and programs such as computer software.

## Example:

Roman *engineers* built grand churches and complex systems of water transportation.





# Legion

(le·gion)

Definition:

A division of the Roman army,  
usually comprising 3000 to 6000  
soldiers
