Tilt (tilt)

When something *tilts* it is slanted to one side.

This globe tilts to the left.



Pole (pole)

A *pole* is a long and thin object. A *pole* runs through the inside of this globe to hold it in place on the globe stand.

Earth's movement around the sun and Earth's tilt cause the seasons to change.

A *season* is a period of time during the year characterized by certain weather.

Season (sea·son)

Seasons are experienced differently all around the world depending on how close the sun is to that part of the world.

Sunlight

(sun·light)

Sunlight is the light that comes from the sun. The closer the Earth tilts to the sun the more sunlight that part of the Earth receives.

The first day of summer is the longest day of the year because the Earth is tilted closest to the sun.

(fall)

During the *fall* the amount of sunlight becomes less and the days become shorter.

Shorter

(short·er)

When something is *shorter* it means that it has less length when compared to other things. Length is a measurement of distance or time. When days become *shorter*, the measurement being described is time.
