(Bar·rel)



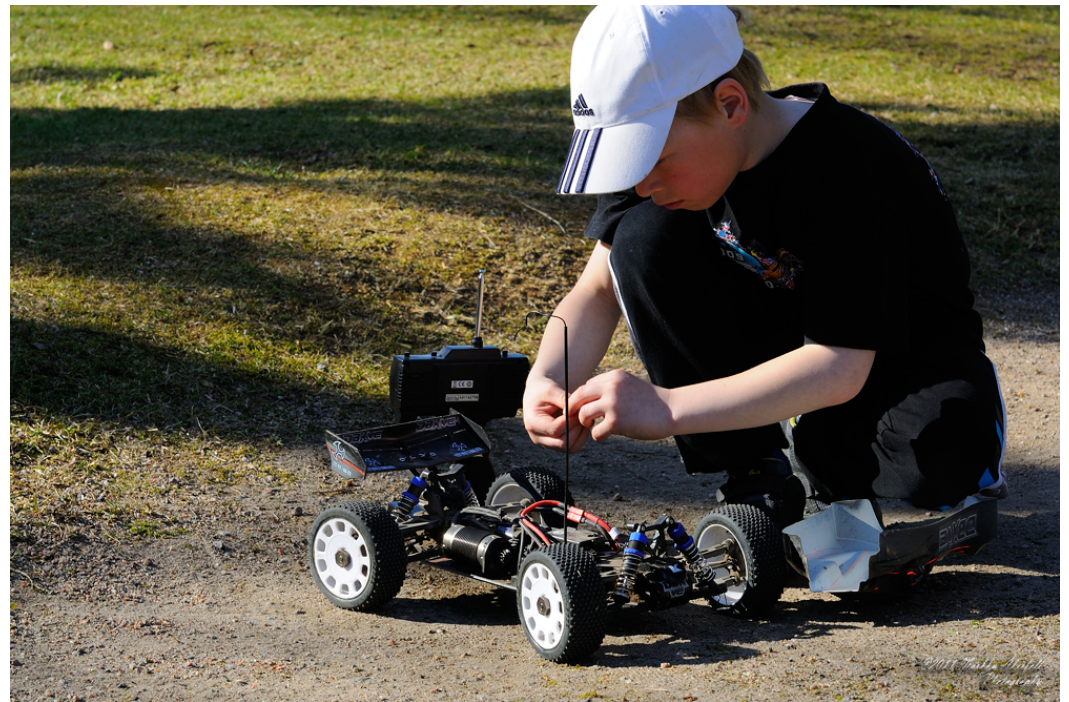
**Hoop**

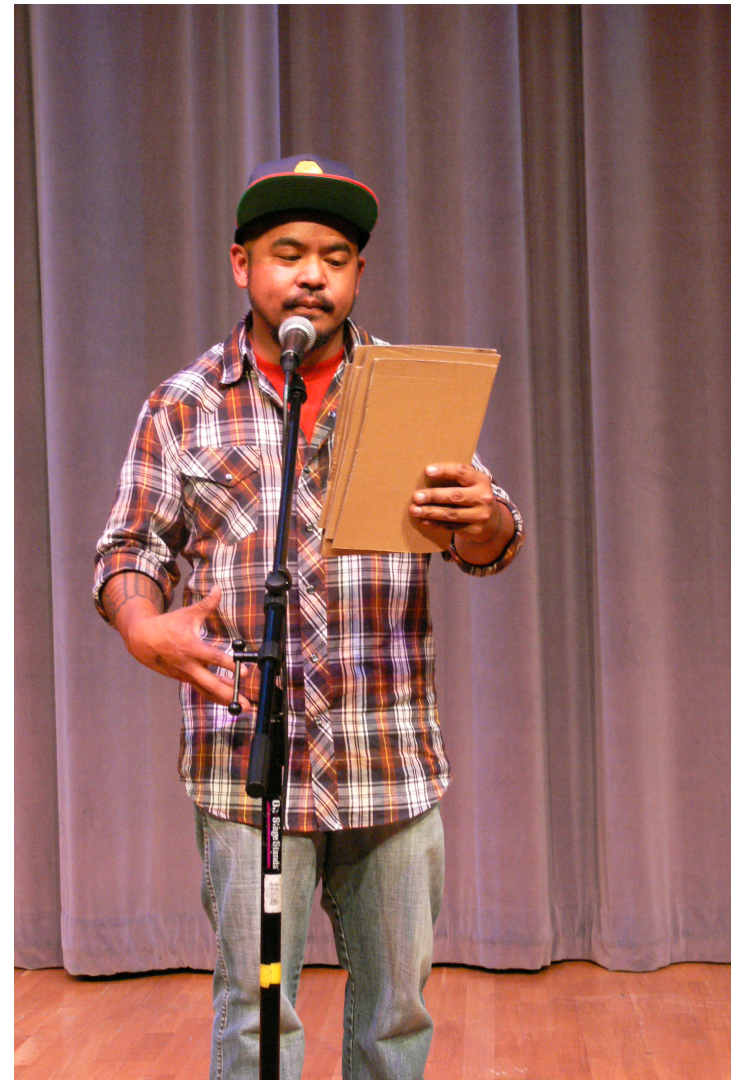

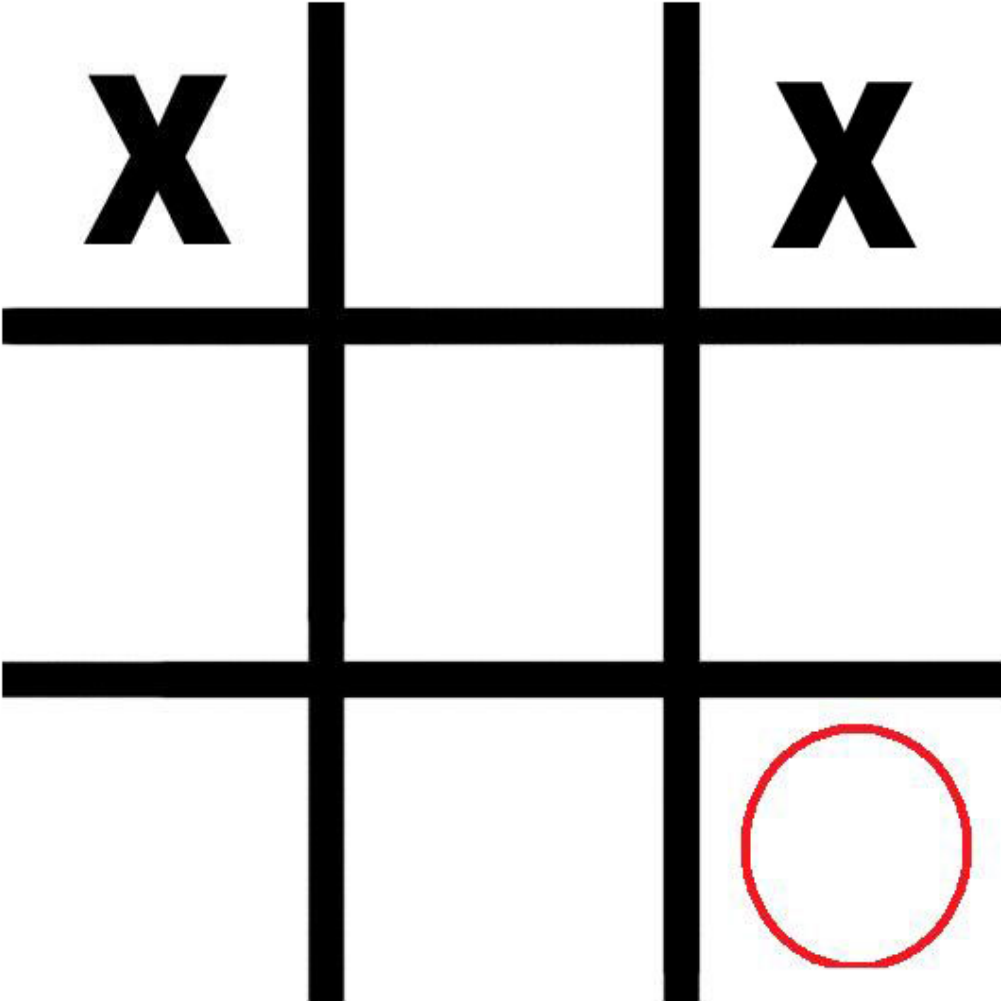
