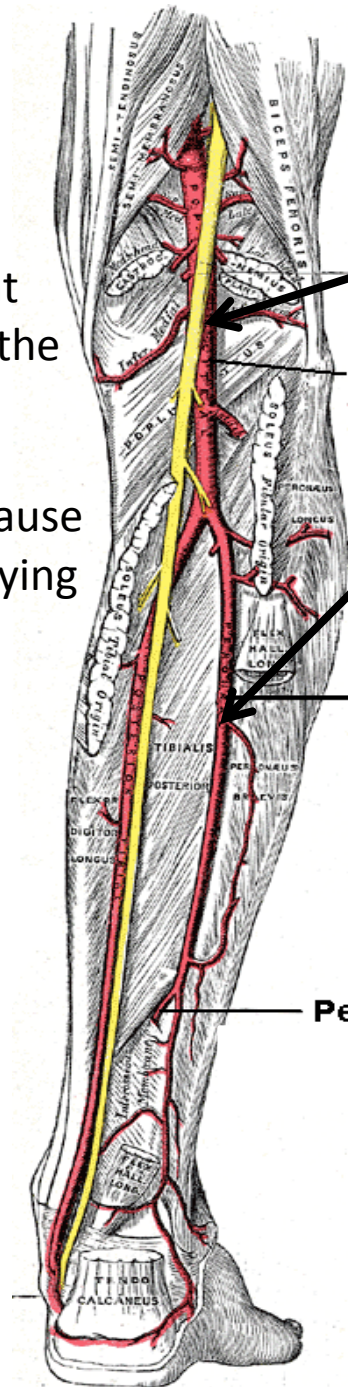

Arteries

Definition: one of the tubes that carry blood from your heart to the rest of the body.

Example: *Arteries* look red because the red blood cells in it are carrying oxygen to the rest of the body.



Protective

Definition: Something that is used or intended to keep a person or parts of a person safe.

Example: This man wears a *protective* mask so that he does not smell the chemicals.



Container

Definition: Something such as a bowl, a bag, a bottle, etc. that can be filled with something.

Example: The food in these *containers* are being shipped to another country.

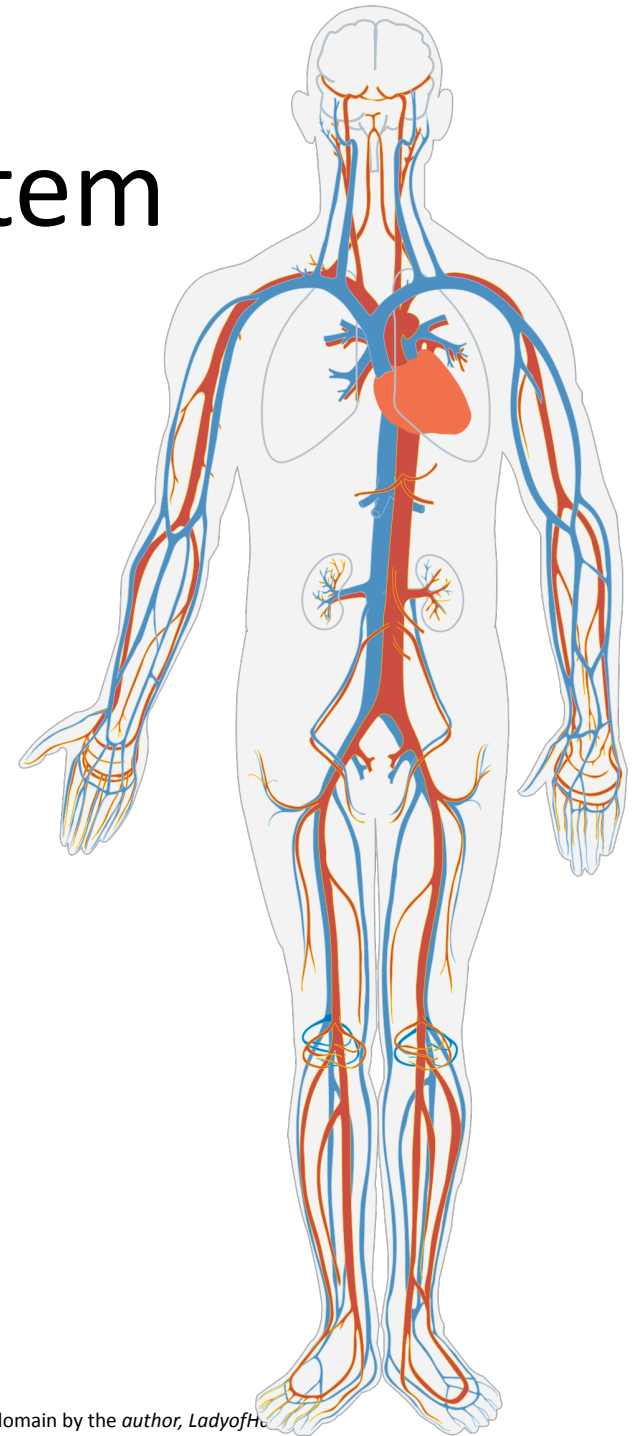

Circulatory System

Definition: One of the systems in the body that is responsible for moving blood around the entire body.

Example: These arteries are a part of a human's *circulatory system* to help pump blood throughout the body.



Oxygen

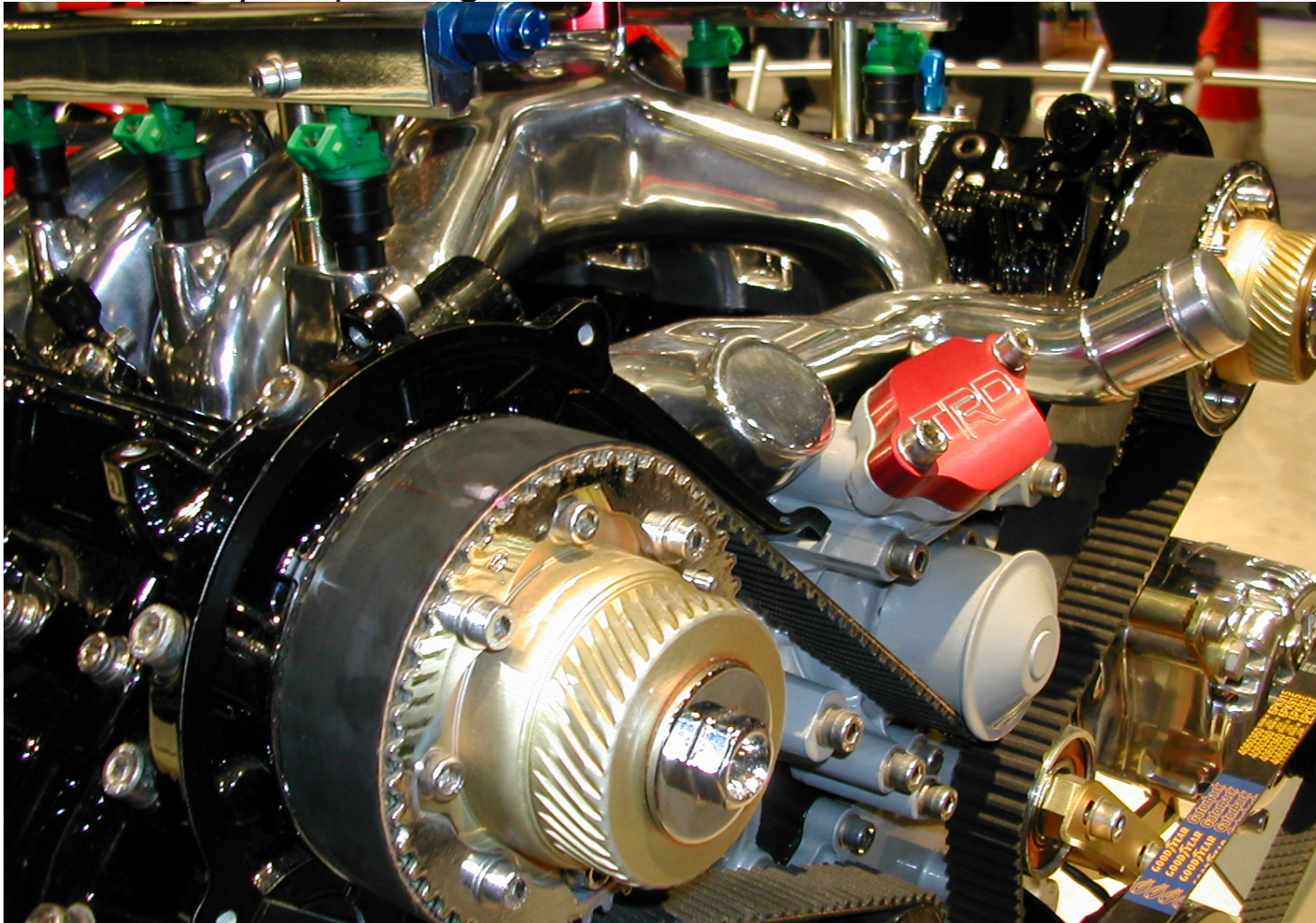
Definition: A gas in the air that has no color, smell, taste, and that all plants and animals need to live.

Example: The *oxygen* tanks on these peoples back help them breathe underwater.

Complex

Definition: Something that is complex has a lot of different parts, and is difficult to understand or deal with.

Example: Cars have a very *complex* engine.

Goosebumps

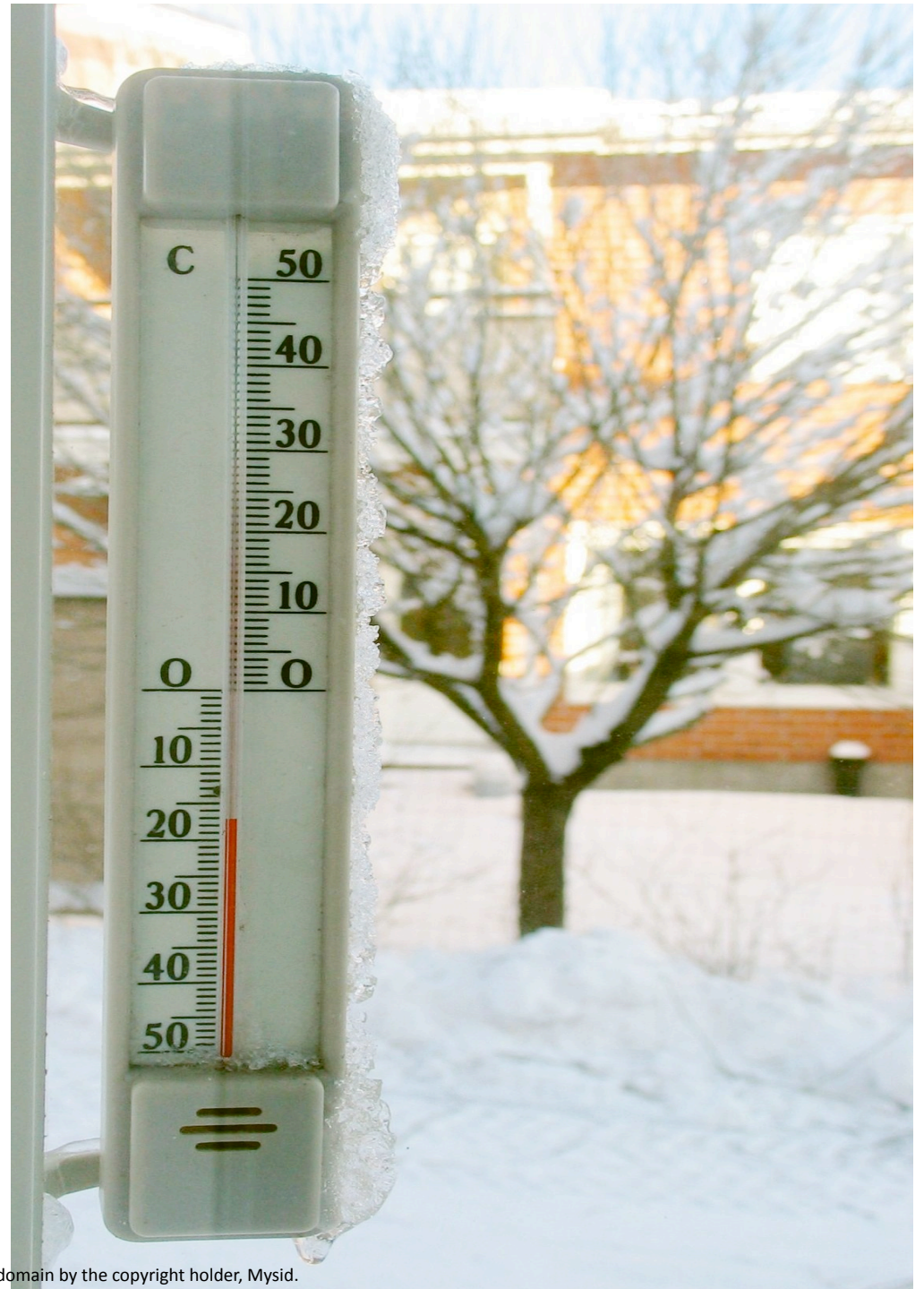

Temperature

Definition: How hot or cold something is.

Example: The city is covered in snow because the *temperature* is very low.

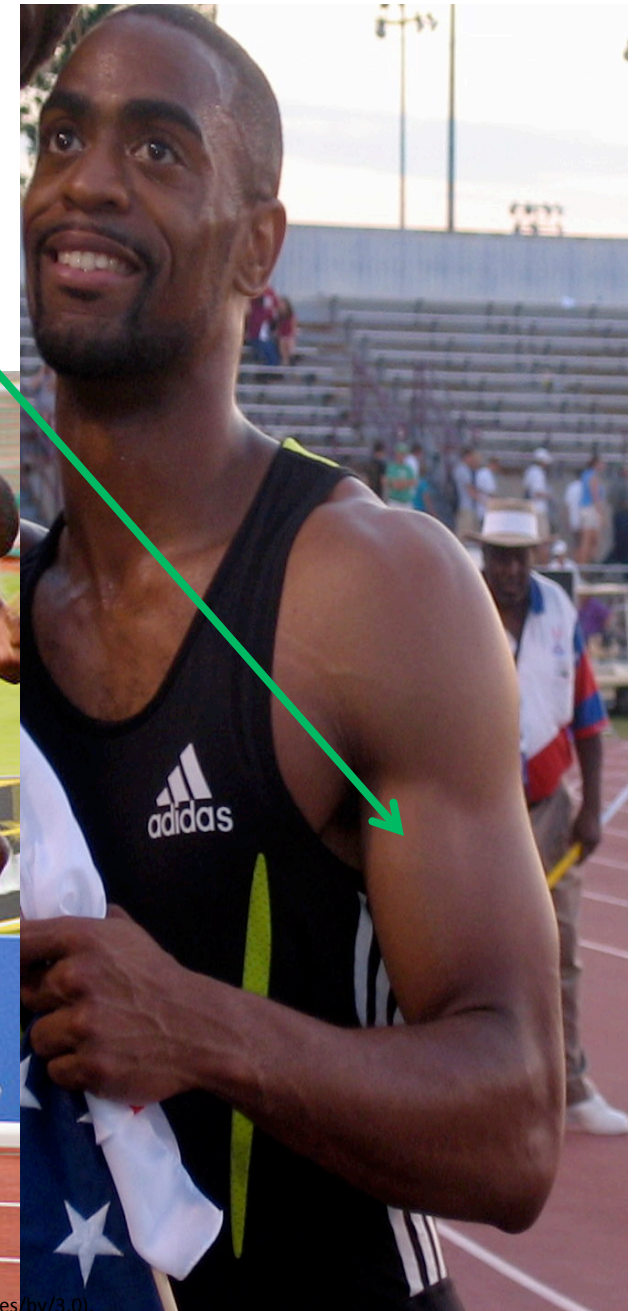

Muscles
