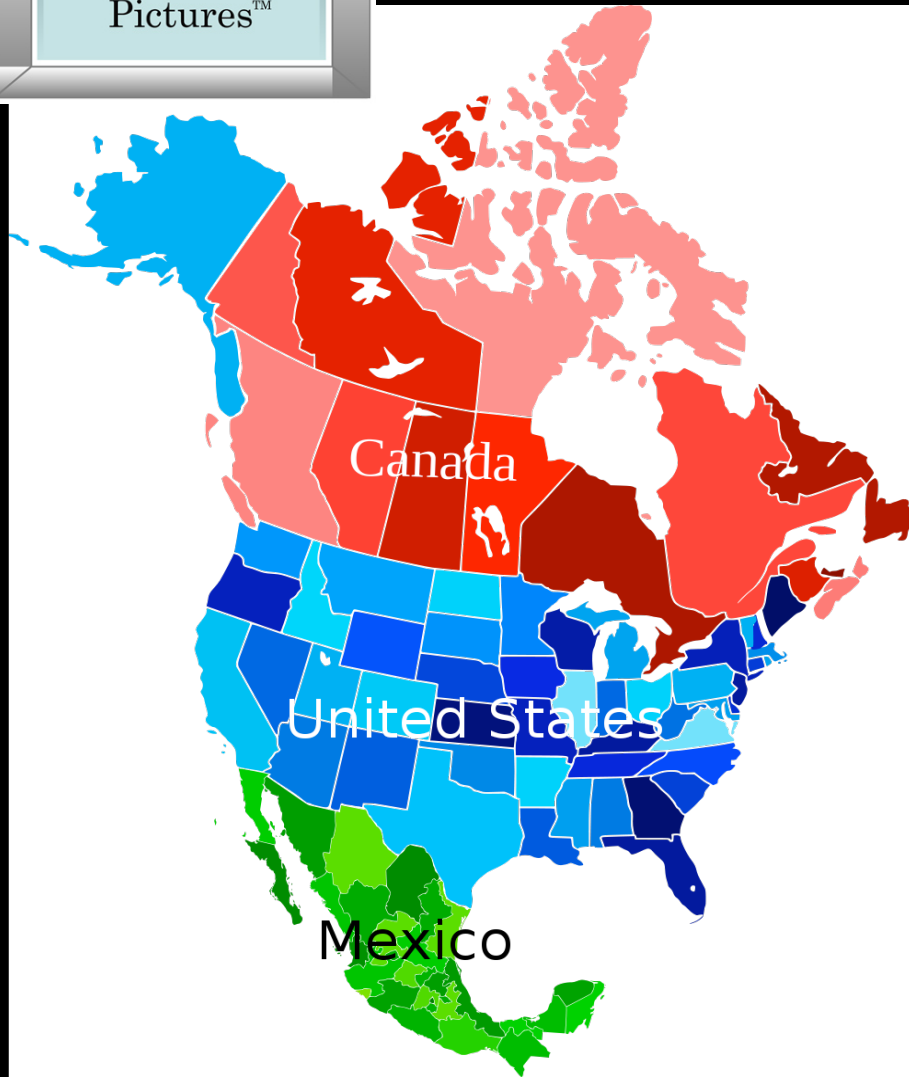


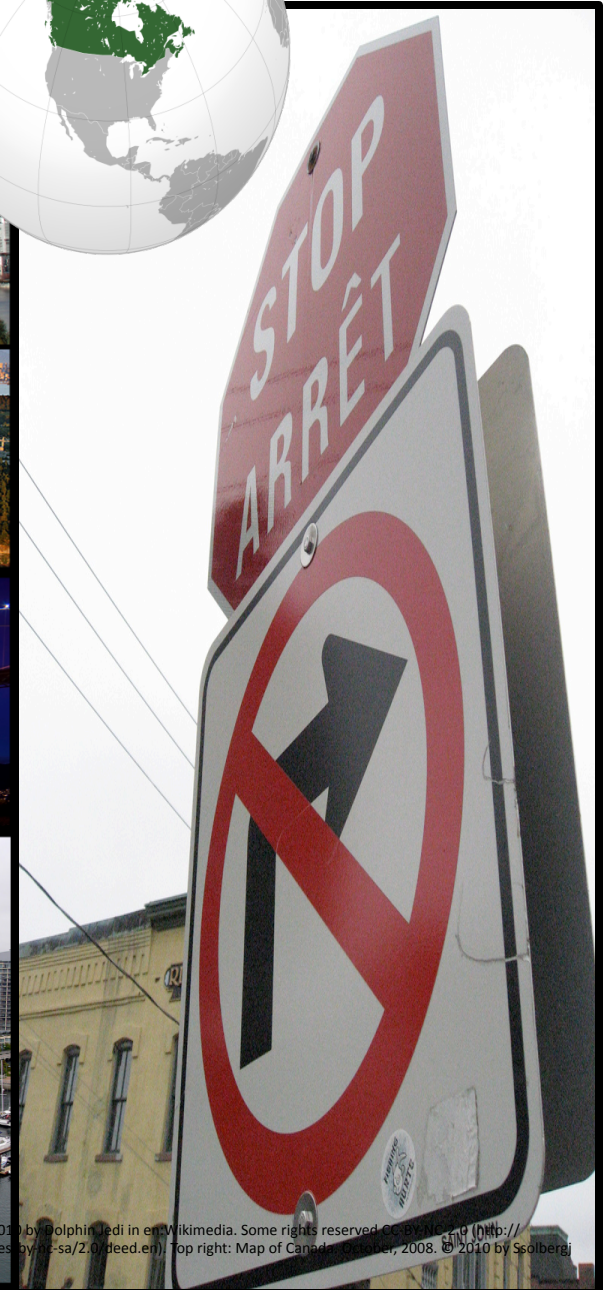

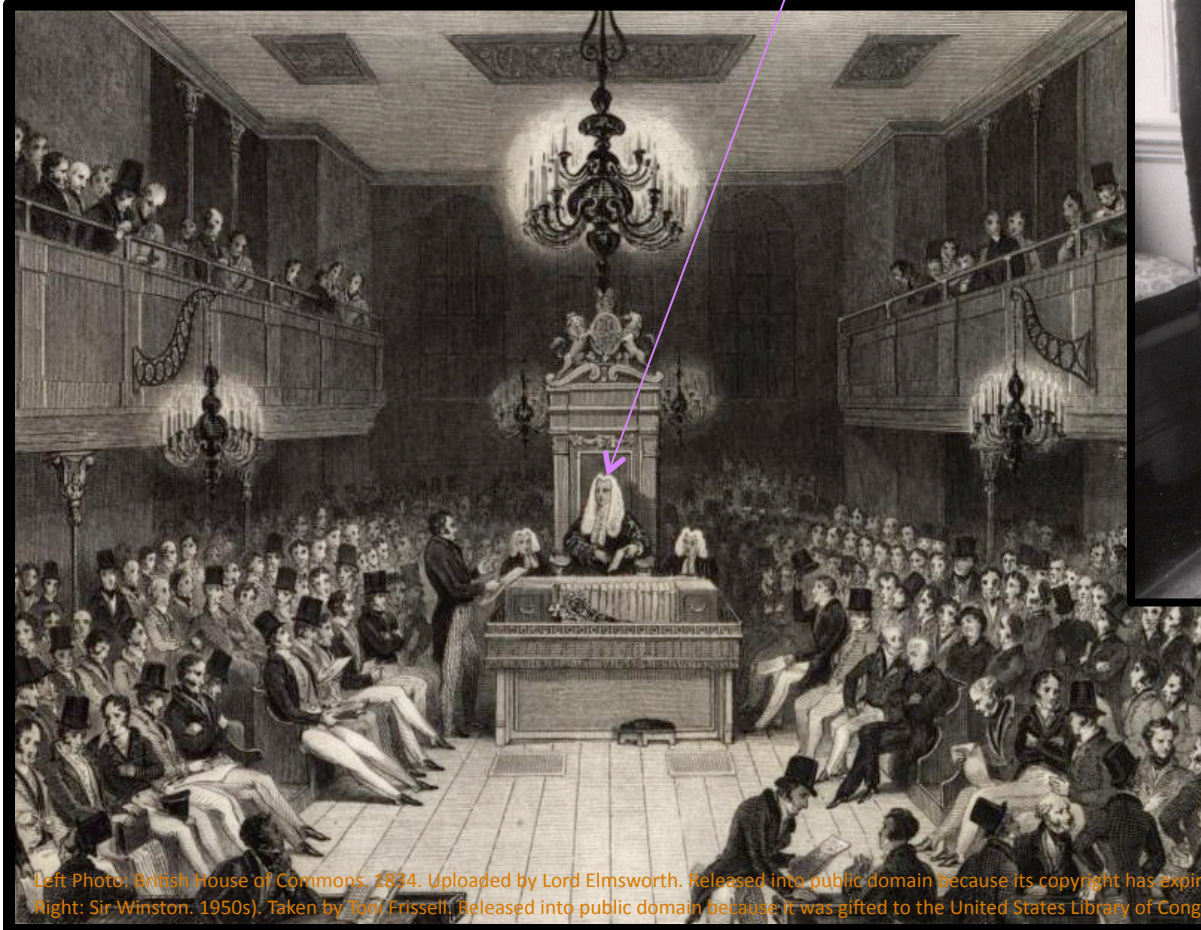

Prime Minister

Definition: the leader of the government in countries that have parliament.

Example: England has had many *prime ministers*, but Winston Churchill is one of the most famous for his role in the second World War.

Definition: liked by a lot of people

Example: The Golden Gate Bridge is a very *popular* place for people to visit when they come to San Francisco.

Population

Definition: someone who works in a job that needs special education and training.

Example: Doctors are *professionals* in medicine and know how to make people feel better.

Representatives

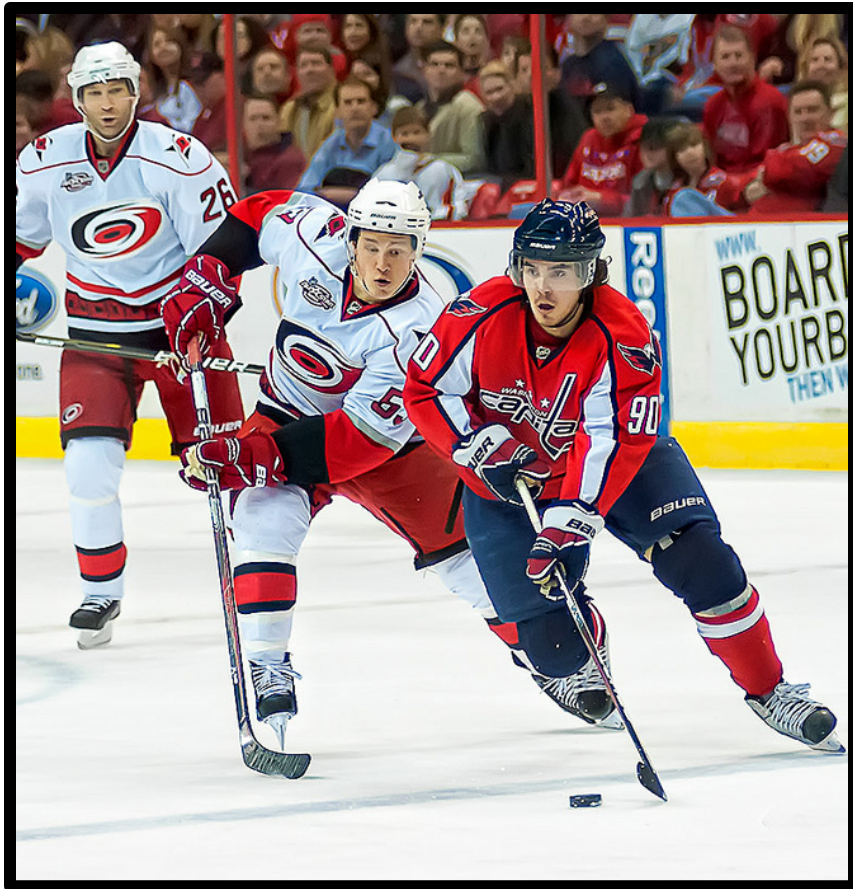
Definition: someone who is chosen to act, speak, vote, etc for someone else.

Example: President Obama speaks with *representatives* of the United States Trade department about future plans.

Settlers

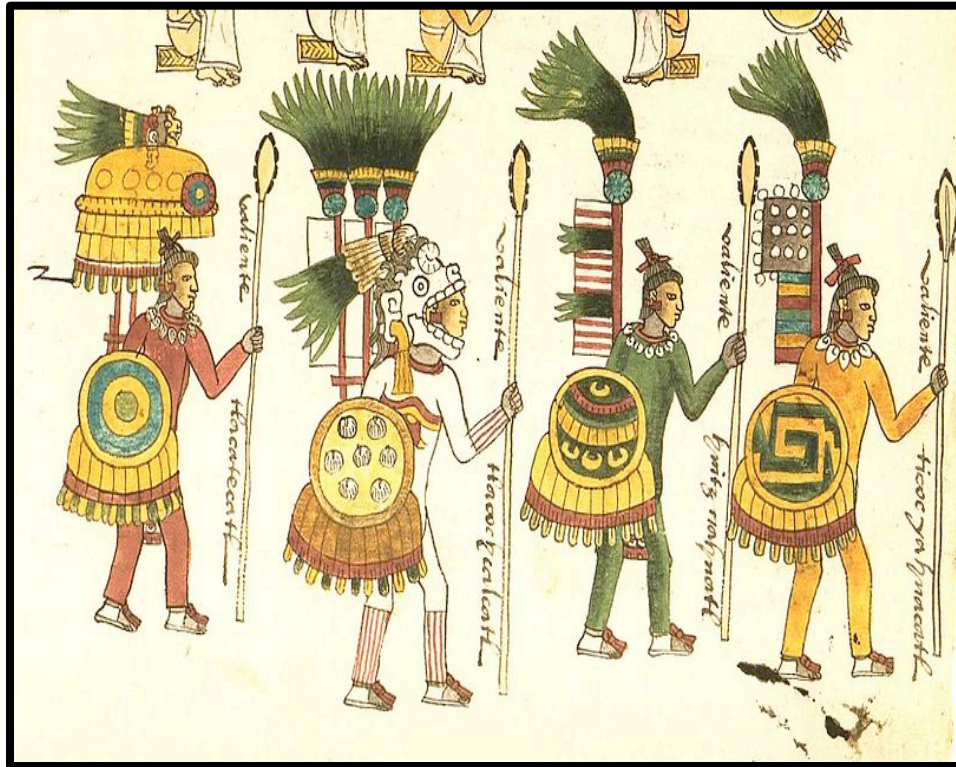
Definition: someone who goes to live in a new place, usually where there were few people before

Example: Early *settlers* had to build their homes on the new land.

Aztecs



Definition: one of the tribes who lived in and controlled Mexico from the 14th century until the 16th century.

Example: Many of the buildings that Aztecs built by hand still stand today in Mexico.
