

POSSIBLE TEXTS: Fluency Development*

In addition to QuickReads (a set of fluency readers that have been developed by Elfrieda H. Hiebert to promote fluency, comprehension, and vocabulary development), the following texts have been identified by teachers as helpful in developing fluency.

- **Capstone Curriculum Publishing (variety of theme-pack little books such as wildlife)**
- **Dominie: Topics such as Marine Life, Habitats of the World**
- **Pacific Learning's Orbit Chapter books (half are informational)**
- **Pearson Learning's Very First Chapters (some informational)**
- **Read Naturally**
- **Reading for Content**
- **Rigby's PM Collection (includes narrative as well as informational)**
- **SRA Specific Skill Series: Getting the Facts (5th Ed.).**
- **Steck-Vaughn's Pair-it books**
- **Wright Group's Wildcats**

***Inclusion on this list by no means indicates that texts will have the features of "few hard words per 100" that characterized the texts used in the fluency studies reviewed by the National Reading Panel. Participants in workshops have identified the texts on this list over the past 18 months as having texts that have been or might be used for fluency practice (with a particular emphasis on informational content).**
