## Symbols of the United States

## Stars and Stripes

Sometimes the flag of the United States is called the Stars and Stripes. A look at the flag will tell you why. Each star on the flag stands for a state in the United States. Every time a new state was added to the United States, a star was added to the flag. The flag now has 50 stars.

There are also 13 stripes on the flag. The number of stripes stays the same. The stripes stand for the areas that became the first 13 states in the United States.

## Red, White, and Blue

## Bald Eagle
